Please Note:

Invigilators should be in the exam room (Classroom 1) **at least 40 minutes** before the due starting time, i.e. 8:20 a.m.

Students and other Faculty should be there **at least 30 minutes** beforehand, to ensure that all preparations are completed in good time.

Exams will start promptly at the times indicated. Latecomers will not be given extra time.

Students should familiarise themselves with the instructions and regulations posted outside the exam room.

Students are required to show their Student I.D. card on entry to the exam room.

No notes, textbooks or other materials will be allowed in the vicinity once the exam starts. *No cell phones will be allowed in the exam room.*

Answer booklets will be provided, as well as unmarked Bibles where necessary.

Students should fill in their personal details on the attendance slip and the front cover of the answer booklet.

Lecturers should check their question paper to ensure that all instructions are included and are clear. Any mistakes or alterations to the questions should be reported immediately to the Chief Invigilator.

Students may not leave the exam room within the **first hour** or the **last 15 minutes** of the scheduled time.

The Invigilators will take a register of candidates present and, at the end of the exam, will confirm the submission of the relevant scripts against each candidate's PIN.

The scripts will be stored in the College safe overnight, and will be given to the relevant lecturer for marking the next day.
